




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1. Overview of the status of the cluster

21.02.2025: Decision on internal accreditation

by resolution of the Presidential Board of January 29, 2025: Accreditation without conditions, subject to the decision on the system accreditation of the University of Göttingen recommendations for all programs:

- Consideration of consolidation towards regional studies
- Expand the range of modern Indian languages (e.g., Hindi)
- Development of a target group concepts for both programs: Currently, no German or European students are being recruited for the master's program and bachelor's graduates are not being attracted to the master's program. For the bachelor's program, the name of the program should also be reconsidered

Therefore, the following measures have been developed: In order to deal with the specific problems of CeMIS students (including the issue of caste), the introduction of a reporting procedure with ad hoc committees to be set up as required at CeMIS should be examined.
